### **NORTHWOODS OPEN MUSKY FUNDRAISING TOURNAMENT LAKE GROUPS SELECTION LIST**

The tournament includes six (6) different lake groups in the Minocqua area. These lake groups include:

- **Big Arbor Vitae and Little Arbor Vitae**
- **Lake Minocqua & Kawaguesaga**
- **Lake Tomahawk**
- **Clear Lake, Carrol Lake, Sweeney Lake, Gilmore Lake, Madeline Lake**
- **Squirrel Lake, Gunlock Lake, Lake Shishebogama**
- **Brandy Lake, Arrowhead Lake, Johnson Lake**

When you register for the tournament ([www.northwoodsmuskies.com](http://www.northwoodsmuskies.com)), you will be asked to select three (3) lake groups, in order of preference. Due to DNR regulations, no more than nineteen (19) tournament boats will be awarded on each lake group. Awarding of lake groups will be done on a "first come- first serve" basis in order of entries received on the website. A document will be posted and updated periodically on the website to show lake groups awarded by entry.

If you are awarded one of the lake groups with multiple lakes, you are allowed to switch between lakes during the tournament if you'd like. Simply trailer your boat (if necessary) and proceed to another lake in that lake group anytime between 6AM and 4PM.

There will be no "tournament take-off" as different lake groups exist. Fishing hours will be from 6AM to 4PM and the honor system will be used for start and end times. Please show good sportsmanship and adhere to start and end times. You may launch your boat any time you wish on tournament day but tournament fishing hours do not start until 6AM. Official tournament time synchronization will take place at the pre-tournament meeting (mandatory attendance) on Friday evening June 27th at 7PM at Island City Lanes in Minocqua.

The tournament committee has selected a diversity of lakes in the area to offer tournament anglers different conditions and circumstances that match their personal preferences. Some lakes on the list are big, deep and relatively clear. They generally tend to offer bigger fish in lower numbers. Others on the list are more readily classified as "action" lakes, some smaller and shallower, and often displaying more fish but generally offering fish that don't run as large.

We wish you all good luck and remind you that whether it's your first Muskie or your biggest Muskie... "Make it a Northwoods Muskie"!
